

Agonisingly close to pulling off an upset win against 2nd placed Ascot Park, Gawler's Div 1 team walked away with a solitary point in an absorbing battle on their opposition's home turf. Drawing 1 rink courtesy of Shane Bevin and his lads and a single shot down in 2 others, it was a case of so near yet so far as they were defeated by 6 shots. Now with a settled line up, they have the ability to cause upsets but at the same time will need to keep an eye on the relegation zone.

Although not super impressive, the Div 4 team got the job done, outlasting Modbury by 13 shots. Ian Cameron's four notched an 11 shot win and Teresa Dean's crew continue to perform well, 7 shots up at the end of play. Taking 12 of the 16 points on offer still sees them sitting in 3rd spot on the ladder and staking a claim for a finals berth.

Illustrating the closeness of the competition, the Div 5 side fell from 3rd to 5th when they succumbed to Salisbury Red by 9 shots. Kingsley Branson's charges provided the win but with all rinks competitive, it shows they are well and truly in the mix for a top 4 spot. With another tough game this week against fellow top 4 hopeful, Hope Valley, a win should keep them in contention.
