

With only 1 rink left on the green and all players huddled around it cheering every bowl, Mark Newton's four held their nerve to ensure Gawler's Div 1 side recorded their first win of the season. Toppling last season's Premier side Ascot Park by 7 shots was a morale boosting result, especially considering the unavailability of gun skipper Shane Bevin.
