

Gawler's Div 1 team recorded a very important win on Saturday when they defeated top 4 side Morphett Vale on their own turf. Splitting the rinks 2-2 but winning the shot count 81-75, they showed that they have got what it takes to stay in this very tough division. Daryl Kubisch's crew have been the constant, not only winning but doing so with the minimum of fuss and doing it comfortably. The addition of Trevor Grant at number 2 has been a factor along with the recovery of Kubisch after serious illness.
