

In a top of the table clash, Gawler's Div 2 team triumphed over home side Henley by 17 shots to move into 1st place on the ladder.

In wet and windy conditions and on a green where success has previously eluded them, they grabbed 3 rinks and a valuable 14 away points. Daryl Kubisch's four snatched a 2 shot win on the last end, Leigh Roberts guided his lads to a 5 shot win and the four of Clifton, Dean, Hatcher and Marsden were impressive, finishing 18 shots up.

The Div 5 Red team have also seemingly hit their straps with a 36 shot win over top 4 side, Para Hills. The 16 points sees them elevated to top spot for the first time this season and with this week's game against bottom side, Prospect Broadview, they are a good chance to stay there. Taking all rinks, with 3 of them by 2 shots, the difference was the outstanding performance of Wildy, Boucher, Parker and Kirby who crushed their opponents 35-5.

Even though splitting the rinks 2-2, the Div 5 White side fell 19 shots short against visiting team Hope Valley. A hard fought 1 shot win to Kingsley Branson's lads was bettered by the four of Goodrich, Betton, Roach and Shirley Branson with a runaway 31-17 score line. Banking 4 points for the day, they keep in touch with 8th placed Modbury and will hope to further improve their position when they host Para Hills this week.

It was a great result for the Div 7, defeating 4th placed and higher ranked Semaphore on their home turf by 12 shots.

The 10 points earned for the win sees them jump into 4th place and within striking distance of top spot. Barry Bradbrook snr. guided his charges to a 6 shot win but bragging rights goes to the four of Hiney, Higgins, Woods and skipper Hamilton who finished the day 11 up.
