

A demoralising 13 shot loss to bottom side Brighton sees Gawler's division 2 team sink to 8th place and just clear of the relegation zone. With only a draw to show for its efforts it is now in a must win situation when it hosts 7th placed Port Noarlunga this week who are in good form after drawing with undefeated Adelaide this round.
