

A 7 shot loss to visiting side Henley sees Gawler's division 2 side in a parlous situation. What could have reasonably expected to be a home win didn't eventuate and has resulted in it sinking to 7th and only 9 points from the relegation zone. With a win in this week's game against top team Salisbury unlikely, it appears that it's fate will hinge on the final game of the year when it hosts Port Noarlunga.

The division 5 Red team continued it's excellent second half of the season with an authoritative 40 shot win away to Para Hills. Never a happy hunting ground for visiting sides, it was a commanding performance by the top of the table team. In what has become a race in 2 for the pennant, it is unfortunate that they don't play each other in the final 2 rounds as they sit head and shoulders above all other sides in this division and both seem guaranteed to post wins in their last 2 games. Still, the Gawler team can do no more than win and it is doing it handsomely each week. With all 3 rinks winning well, it was the four of Houghton, Ransom, Cufone and skipper Hamilton who took bragging rights with a huge 30 shot win.
