

Despite 3 tight rinks, Gawler's Div 1 side was unable to take a point when they travelled to Toorak Burnside. Relegated from Premier League last season, Toorak proved to be too strong but Gawler can take heart in the fact that they stretched the 3rd placed team on their home deck.
